Dates given in italics refer to days which are not included in the main transcription but are covered in the summaries of JR's doings and whereabouts when away from Argyll. These passages are also in italics. The existence of other trivial references not given in this Index is indicated at the end of an entry by the abbreviation 'et al' for 'et alibi'.
